


WBFH...WHO?

WBFH are the call letters of an FM radio station owned by the Bloomfield Hills School District with studios in both Andover and Lahser High Schools. Students from both schools operate the station with the supervision of Station Manager Pete Bowers. Located at 88.1 on your FM dial, WBFH is a 10 watt, non-commercial, educational radio station on the air weekdays from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. Licensed in 1976 by the Federal Communications Commission to the Board of Education of the Bloom-

field Hills Schools, WBFH is now into its third year with another schedule of numerous programs and features in the community interest, while providing many students with actual on-the-air experience. WBFH serves residents of Bloomfield Hills, Bloomfield Township, West Bloomfield, Birmingham, Pontiac, Troy, Franklin, Orchard Lake, Rochester, Beverly Hills, Auburn Heights, and Keego Harbor. - 2. School closing announcements broadcast continuously within fifteen minutes after the decision is made.
- 3. Comprehensive School Board Meeting reports at 4:30 p.m. the day after the meeting.
- 4. High School and Jr. High sports action including varsity, j.v., and 9th grade football, soccer, girls basketball, varsity and j.v. boys basketball, hockey,,baseball, and softball.
- 5. Public Service Announcements concerning area events especially those in the Bloomfield Hills Schools.
- 6. Interviews with school district faculty and staff as well as people-in-the- news around the Oakland County area.
- 7. Tapes of all school district band, choral, and orchestra concerts aired on WBFH.
- 8. Job openings for young people from the Youth Employment Service aired daily at 4:30 p.m.
- 9. Live music from area musicians and singers on the program "live from Studio B".
- 10. 25% more music than commercial stations because WBFH plays no commercials.
- 11. Health and consumer information that you won't find on other stations.
- 12. School Board Election results aired as soon as votes are tabulated.
- 13. Homegrown talent as DJ's, news-casters, talk show hosts, interviewers, and other on-air reports.
- 14. Your favorite songs are played because we do answer the phones and we do play requests.

When Mr. Bowers was hired in the summer of 1976, the radio station wasn't much more than a bunch of boxes and open space. A lot has happened since then and it keeps progressing daily. Mr. Bowers graduated from Central Michigan University in 1975 with a Bachelor of Applied Arts degree with a major in Broadcast and Cinematic Arts and a minor in Photojournalism. He has worked at WMHW-FM, WWJ, and WCHP, where he was Sales Manager, Sports Director, and Continuity Director as well as a DJ and newsman. An Andover graduate of 1971, Pete also devotes time to directing a day camp and coaching little league soccer teams. Pete and his wife Claudia live in Pontiac.

HOW YOU CAN ENROLL IN THE RADIO BROADCASTING PROGRAM

No matter how old you are, you can get involved with the radio broadcasting program. If you are a student at either Andover or Lahser High School, enroll in the class entitled "Fundamentals of Radio Broadcasting" which is offered one period each semester for one half credit. This class focuses on the history of radio, current radio formats, the newscast, the interview, how to be a disc jockey, getting a third class operator's license, and careers in radio. After completing this course, students may apply to be on the WBFH staff where students get credit for working on the radio station. Elementary and Jr. High students may enroll in the "Be a DJ" program offered through the Recreation Department. Anybody can enter our "Guest DJ" contest where you can be a disc jockey on WBFH for one hour. 
